Dr. Richard Kiper

Retired Lieutenant Colonel (West Point, 1967) earned his Ph.D. in history from the University of Kansas. He has taught at West Point, at the U.S. Army Command and General Staff College, Kansas City Community College, and the American Military University. Author of numerous articles and books including award-winning *Major General John Alexander McClelland: Politician in Uniform* and *Dear Catharine, Dear Taylor: The Civil War Letters of a Civil War Soldier and His Wife*.



Brian K. McCutchen

Has served in positions of ranger, historian and superintendent of numerous national parks and programs. He has conducted research on Civil War monuments, their history and preservation. He is the co-author of the book, *Shiloh National Military Park*, a part of the Arcadia Publishing "Images of America." series.



Dr. Timothy B. Smith

Earned his Ph.D. from Mississippi State University, is a veteran of the National Park Service, and currently teaches history at the University of Tennessee-Martin. He is the author, editor or co-editor of 14 books, including *Champion Hill: Decisive Battle for Vicksburg and Corinth 1862: Siege, Battle, Occupation*, which won the Fletcher Pratt Award. His most recent book is *Shiloh: Conquer or Perish*.

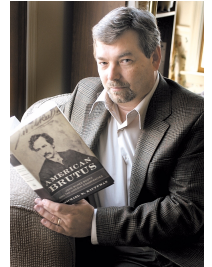

Michael Kauffman

As historian William C. Davis once wrote, "no one has studied [John Wilkes] Booth longer or more in depth than Michael W. Kauffman, a well-known figure and voice of reason in the field of Lincoln assassination studies."



For more than 40 years, Kauffman has been a fixture at assassination-related symposia, tours, and news events. He has written numerous articles on the subject, and his bus tours of the John Wilkes Booth Escape Route, long a staple of feature publications throughout the U.S., inspired the *Washington Post* to call him "legendary" in their field.

He has lectured throughout the United States, and has written for *Civil War Times*, the *Washington Post*, *American Heritage*, *Blue and Gray*, and the *Lincoln Herald*, among others. You may have seen him on A&E, the Learning Channel, the History Channel, National Geographic Channel, and the Discovery Channel, or any number of other media outlets.

He is the author of *American Brutus: John Wilkes Booth and the Lincoln Conspiracies*, which was named by the *New York Times*, the *Washington Post*, and other major media as one of the best non-fiction books of 2004. This all-encompassing account of the Lincoln conspiracy is based entirely on primary sources, and was named by the *Wall Street Journal* as one of the five best books ever written about political violence. As the late historian David Herbert Donald said, "There are many books [on the assassination] but this is by all means, the best."

Its companion documentary, *The Hunt for John Wilkes Booth*, appears regularly on the History Channel, and has spawned a cottage industry in assassination-related tours. In 2012, the highlights of Kauffman's tours became a book, CD and interactive iPhone package called *In the Footsteps of an Assassin*.

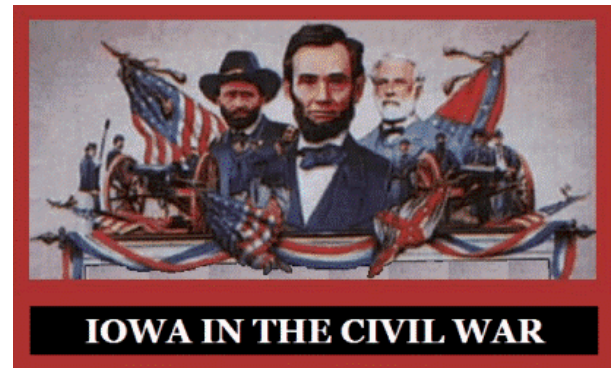
